MAIN MAGMA CHAMBER

A magma chamber is a large underground pool of liquid rock found beneath the surface of the Earth. Kept under pressure and given enough time, the magma eventually finds a way to the surface, and the result will be a volcanic eruption.

Since the release of her first EP in 2007, Lovisa Samuelsson's music kept growing secretly until May 2014 and the release of her debut album «Main Magma Chamber» on the record label she founded, Pacaya Records.

Lovisa Samuelsson is a multi-instrumentalist (cello, piano, guitar) and composer who has been rewarded with Ted Gärdestad scholarship, toured North America and Europe, had a starring role in Swedish National Television production *Bastian*, written theater music and studied music in Cuba.

These are just a few things that are worth mentioning when talking about Lovisa Samuelsson.

In 2013, she started the recording of Main Magma Chamber in Cellar Room Studio with Martin Öhman and Rasmus Persson. The album was mastered at Svenska Grammofonstudion by Hans Olsson Brookes. More than 20 musicians took part in the different recording sessions but the core of Lovisa's band is made of *Isabel Sörling* (vocal, effects), *Hannah Tolf* (vocal, effects), *Anna Lund* (drums), *Helena Ljungman* (bass) and *Jonathan Albrektson* (keyboards). Her music is a subtle and intimate blend of indie pop, jazz and folk.
